

Background

- Population about 12 182 (2025)
- Estonians 66%
- Others 34%
- Now about 500 refugees from Ukraine.
- Over 40 different ethnic groups
- About 50% of Jõhvis population is Russianspeaking





Jõhvi Central Library today

- 1960s cinema-style building, modified into a library
- Limited space for readers & events
- Not adapted to digital/modern needs
- About 500m²





Vision & Goals

Vision & Role

- A library as a community centre
- Flexible spaces for learning, culture, and events
- Focus on technology and innovation
- Open, welcoming architecture

Design & Location

- Situated in the new education & culture campus
- Large reading areas with natural light
- Dedicated children's and youth zones
- Multi-use halls for workshops and events
- Outdoor plaza & green spaces
- Total area: 2,500 m²






First Floor Highlights

- Welcoming foyer & café bright space connecting all entrances, with info desk and periodicals
- Two event halls Small hall (≈50 people), Large hall (≈100 people)
- Recording studio for youth media, music, and professional use
- Children's area play zone for babies & toddlers, reading space
- Day centre & hobby rooms art and language classrooms, club rooms, multipurpose hall
- Resilience centre designed to serve community needs in crisis situations
- Kitchens for food service and events and cooking classes





Second Floor Highlights

- Library Core Open layout connecting children's, youth, and general library areas, tiered seating staircase for reading, small screenings, and presentations, balcony with integrated reading nooks overlooking first floor
- Children's & Youth Zone Fairy Tale Room, play zone, storage area
- Soundproof classroom for 28 students, with connected teacher office





Third Floor Highlights

- Library area Quiet, peaceful atmosphere with best views toward the viaduct and a corner balcony
- **Study rooms -** Glass-walled quiet rooms for individual or small-group learning
- **Staff area -** Staff lounge & workrooms, library director's office, shared office for 4 employees, book processing & preparation room





Library as a Community Hub

Current Activities:

- Children & Youth Programs: Story hours, robotics clubs, and creative workshops.
- Community Engagement: Author talks, handicraft circles, and group meetings.
- **Cultural Events:** Exhibitions, concerts, and thematic evenings.
- Educational Workshops: Language classes, digital literacy sessions, and skill-building workshops.





Library as a Community Hub

Future Plans:

- **Expanded Spaces:** Larger areas for group activities and events.
- Enhanced Facilities: Dedicated rooms for workshops, meetings, and cultural events.
- **Technology Integration:** Makerspaces, digital labs, and interactive learning zones.
- Community Collaboration: Partnerships with local organizations for diverse programs.
