
Special from last month

On March 26, the State Chancellery of Latvia held a webinar for senior-level managers in public administration. NCM Latvia provided for a Nordic speaker on digital transformation in the public sector "Digital Transformation - from Agile Manifesto to Agile Enterprise", a lecture on modern work environments and how to get the most out of a workforce. The lecture was held by Torbjørn Larsen, who is the Executive Director for Digital Transformation at Sopra Steria in Norway and the Chair of the Programme Committee for NordForsk's Research and Innovation Programme on Digitalisation of the Public Sector.

Baltic and Nordic Countries' Responses to the Crisis in Belarus

On April 8 a presentation took place of the policy brief "Baltic and Nordic Countries' Responses to the Crisis in Belarus", conducted by the Latvian Institute of International Affairs and supported by the Nordic Council of Ministers' office in Latvia. The research compares the reactions of Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Iceland, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, and Sweden in light of the Belarus 2020 post-election crisis and assesses implications for the bilateral and multilateral cooperation of the Baltic and Nordic countries with Belarus. Integrating Climate Change Policy into Sectoral and Regional Policies

The Norwegian Ambassador opened a conference of the project "Integrating Climate Change Policy into Sectoral and Regional Policies" on April 9. The program's goal is mitigation and to reduced vulnerability to climate change. The project is part of a larger Norway Grants Climate and Environment Programme in Latvia. It is operated by the Latvian Ministry of Environmental Protection and Regional Development in partnership with the Norwegian Environment Agency. The largest part of the financing in the Programme is targeted at remediation of historically polluted sites in Latvia. A second Norwegian grants programme was launched on April 14. This program is targeting business development, innovation and SMEs in Latvia will launch its first open call for project proposals.

Cultural Planning for Cultural Places

On April 11, the Danish Culture institute, EUNIC-Cultural Institutes in Latvia, Art Cēsis and Culturelab held a webinar in the series "Future Creative Cities". The event was organised by the European Parliament member Dace Melbārde. Three speakers; Emīls Rode, Travor Davies and Hans-Peter Degn, talked about different matters concerning cultural planning, and it was moderated by Mārtiņš Eņģelis. This webinar will be open and available online for all who are interested in local development, cultural planning, and capacity building of local cultural sectors. Currently, there no recording of the event but in the near future, there will be one published on this website.



2nd forum Wood Building Baltic 2021

A large Forum Holzbau webinar, the 2^{nd} forum Wood Building Baltic 2021 is being held on April 14-16. Baltic and Nordic speakers hold presentations on varied topics like "Accelerate low-carbon construction with wood – a Nordic Policy Snapshot" by Anders Vestergaard Jensen, senior adviser at the NCM secretariat. 
Artist's Mental Health: Can an Artist Be Happy?

On April 22 the Danish Cultural Institute in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania, in cooperation with Värske Rõhk, hosts the virtual literary event "Between the lines" focusing on young poets, their works and everyday lives in Denmark and Estonia.



During the event, the Danish poet Marie Skipper and the Estonian poet Kaisa Kuslapuu will read some of their poems to a live online audience. After the poetry readings, Marie and Kaisa will discuss their literary work and the challenges and themes that they each bring up in their poems. The discussion will be moderated by Kaisa Ling who is a co-author at the Estonian literary magazine Värske Rõhk, as well as a translator, artist, literary researcher, and radio presenter for Estonian Public Broadcasting. WindWorks: Powering Latvia's energy future

On April 29, the Latvian Wind Energy Association in close cooperation with the Danish Embassy in Latvia and business technology platform BiSMART will hold a conference "WindWorks. Powering Latvia's energy future" - a hybrid wind energy conference bringing together experienced international energy experts, stakeholders and policymakers to discuss the future of wind energy in Latvia. Wind energy is a fast-growing energy technology, but to deliver on its vast potential, substantial investments, favourable policies and regulation in support would be needed. Embracing Dignity: Prevention of trafficking

On March 31, the Embassy of Sweden launched a project with an NGO Center MARTA called "Embracing Dignity: Prevention of trafficking for sexual exploitation". Center MARTA organized a discussion between Swedish and French experts and Latvian members of parliament. During the discussion, the experts shared their countries' respective approach to the human trafficking problem and their abolitionist approach to prostitution, which focuses on penalizing the buyer of sex and not the seller. This project will continue during the spring and continue into the summer.
